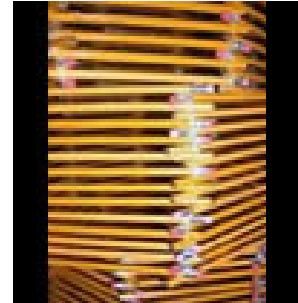


International One March for Children, December '05

The International ONE March for Children started in 2005 when over 3000 school children marched in silence to raise money and awareness for children orphaned by AIDS in Africa. These are some images and writings from the school children who marched.
